





About the APWF's KnowledgeHubs

• The Asia Pacific Water Forum (APWF) is an independent, not-for-profit, nonpartisan and nonpolitical network dedicated to improving sustainable water management. Under the impulsion of APWF was created a network of regional water expert organizations called the *knowledgeHubs*.

- Each *KnowledgeHub* has a specific priority water topic and focuses on improving water security, promoting knowledge exchange and solutions to solve water issues in the Asia-Pacific region.
- There are currently 17 hubs covering different water knowledge domains. Besides JSC, the two following Japanese organizations are also members of the *KnowledgeHubs* network:
 - Global Center of Excellence for Water Hazard and Risk Management (ICHARM)
 - Institute for Global Environmental Strategies (IGES)
- JSC was endorsed as a new *knowledgeHub* along with IGES, at the APWF Governing Council held in Singapore in June 2009.

Expectations from JSC

Objectives

- Establish or improve policy and political determination to develop sanitation
- Increase technical competence
- Build capacity in wastewater/sludge management to construct and diffuse:
 - basic sanitation (toilets) with proper wastewater/sludge treatment systems
 - on-site sanitation (including the Packaged Aerated Wastewater Treatment Plant (PAWTP) or johkasou, and night soil/sludge collection & treatment)
 - off-site sanitation (sewerage)

Tasks

- Network with international organizations in each country of the region to build and improve capacity in sanitation
- Gather, share and spread knowledge information through the *KnowledgeHubs* network and collaboration with international organizations
- Support, advise clients and partners (central & local governments, NGOs, etc.)

Activities

- Network with each country of the region and organize international seminars:
 - identify sanitation-related institutions in each country; create and manage information networks
 - hold international seminars to spread knowledge and experiences
- Conduct comprehensive country assessments:
 - conduct assessments for sanitation improvement in each country with a team of experts from government, industry and academia
 - advise and assist in operations/projects launched by international donor organizations such as ADB and JICA (project assessment, suitable technology selection, etc.)
- Create and manage a sanitation database for the Asia-Pacific region
- Cooperate with international organizations such as UNICEF, the World Toilet Organization, NGOs, NPOs, etc.
